




WHERE OUR GRANTS GO

SPOTLIGHT ON...

ENGLAND

The Morrisons Foundation has awarded over £1.9 million through the grant programme in England. So far we've worked with over 250 charities to make a real difference to people in local communities – and we're delighted to see that so many have benefitted from our donations.

EPILEPSY ACTION

The charity received a £16,030 donation to upgrade their online support and resources. This has helped children aged 7-11 living with epilepsy to understand



their condition. Fundraising Officer Mary-Ellen Ward said: "Thanks to the generous grant from the Morrisons Foundation, we'll now be able to enhance our materials to develop a comprehensive and engaging package of online resources to improve the wellbeing and daily lives of children with epilepsy."

HEY SMILE FOUNDATION



With our donation of £9,254, the HEY Smile Foundation has created a bank of equipment that local charities and community groups can borrow – including gazebos, computers and outdoor games. This helps the charity respond creatively to areas of need and support people in the local community.

WELLCHILD

WellChild received £20,000, which helped to renovate the gardens and bedrooms of children with serious illnesses. making them more suitable for their needs. Chief Executive Colin Dver said: "We were delighted to receive a donation of £20,000 from the Morrisons Foundation. It's allowed us to improve the lives of more seriously

A donation of £27,750 enabled Variety to buy a new Sunshine Coach. The coach offers disabled and disadvantaged children the opportunity to take part in new experiences that they would otherwise not have access to. Lyn Staunton, Development Director, said: "The support given by the Morrisons Foundation to sponsor a Sunshine Coach will change the lives of so many disabled and disadvantaged children in so many more positive ways."

Our donation of \$9,544 helped the charity to install the equipment needed to allow severely handicapped people to enjoy sailing.

SCOTLAND

Our support in Scotland has exceeded £335,000 donated to charities working to make a positive difference to people's lives. From Dumfries to Inverness, Glasgow to Aberdeen, our grants have covered the length and breadth of the country and helped some great charities to continue their vital work.

CHILDREN IN POVERTY INVERCLYDE

With £35,000, Children in Poverty purchased a holiday home to offer breaks to children and families from deprived local areas. Chairman Pat Burke said: "This will enable us to reach more children across Inverclyde who live in poverty, who won't have a holiday and who never get the opportunity to enjoy the fun outdoors as a family."



KILBRYDE HOSPICE

The hospice used our £18,000 donation to expand their music therapy and exercise classes. The sessions provide a safe and supportive environment in which people can enjoy the friendly atmosphere of the day hospice drop-in centre.



FISHERMEN'S MISSION

Our £20,000 donation

is supporting the charity's 'Making a Difference – Fishermen for the Future' project, which offers young people the opportunity to train for a future in the fishing industry. For some, it will be an introduction to the possibilities that being part of the fishing sector can offer, while for others it will provide the funding they need in order to secure their training and gain employment.







SPOTLIGHT ON...

Many Welsh charities have received a cash boost from the Morrisons Foundation's grant programme, and we have so far donated over £150,000 to support projects based in the country. Our support continues to grow and we're committed to making a real difference throughout Wales.

CAVRA

The Civil Aid Voluntary Rescue Association used our £10,000 donation to provide rescue boat operator training - and to purchase new equipment that supports their vital work. The grant will enable the charity to cover a wider area and respond quicker.



DIAL-A-RIDE

Our £5,000 donation helped Dial-A-Ride Denbighshire purchase a new vehicle, used to support people who find it difficult to access public transport. The charity covers all areas from Prestatyn to Abergele to Denbigh, providing a vital service to those who would otherwise be unable to get around.



ITERSENSORY CLUB

An interactive multi-sensory room for people with severe disabilities became a reality thanks to a £10.000 donation. What's more, it's a facility that's open for service users outside the regular Special Educational Needs school hours.







MATCH FUNDING



Morrisons colleagues play an active role in their communities, supporting a variety of local and national charities they often have a personal connection with.

The Morrisons Foundation's match funding offer has been introduced to support the great work that Morrisons colleagues do for charities and to provide an extra boost to their fundraising efforts. In 2015/16:

- Over 95% of match funding applications approved

HOW WE'RE GOVERNED

The Morrisons Foundation is an independent charity governed by a board of Trustees which includes individuals who work for Morrisons and independent Trustees. The board is responsible for advancing the Morrisons Foundation's charitable purposes for the public benefit.

HOW WE'RE FUNDED

Our main source of funding is money from the sale of single-use carrier bags in England, Scotland and Wales. We also receive a proportion of the income generated by charity scratch cards and clothing banks in Morrisons stores.
